FUND OBJECTIVE

The Fund seeks a high total return through capital appreciation while attempting to preserve principal, and secondarily seeks current income.

INVESTMENT PHILOSOPHY

The Fund invests in quality companies that, in the manager's opinion, appear to be temporarily undervalued but have a favorable outlook for long-term growth.

The portfolio managers typically look for companies that possess the following characteristics:

- Leading market positions
- High barriers to market entry and other competitive or technological advantages
- High return on equity and invested capital
- Consistent operating history
- Capable management
- Solid balance sheets
- Good growth prospects

The Fund seeks to achieve a better risk-adjusted return on its equity investments by investing in many types of stocks, including a blend of large, mid-sized and small companies.

We invest the fixed-income portion of the portfolio based on our outlook for interest rates. During periods of rising longer-term interest rates, we focus on bonds with maturities of two to five years. During periods of falling interest rates, we focus on bonds with maturities of five to seven years. We generally do not hold bonds with maturities over ten years.

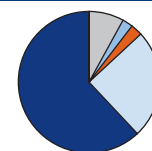

INVESTMENT STRATEGY

The Balanced Fund invests in a diversified portfolio of common stocks and fixed income securities. We select securities that, in our judgment, will result in the highest total return consistent with preservation of principal, and we vary the mix of common stocks and bonds from time to time. More than 50% of the Fund's assets are normally invested in common stocks. We also normally invest at least 25% of the Fund's assets in fixed-income senior securities.

In allocating the Fund's assets between stocks and bonds, we assess the relative return and risk of each asset class, analyzing several factors, including general economic conditions, anticipated future changes in interest rates, and the outlook for stocks generally.

The Fund seeks to achieve a better risk-adjusted return on its equity investments by investing in many types of stocks, including a blend of large, mid-sized and small companies.

The fixed-income securities in which the Balanced Fund may invest include corporate bonds, mortgage-related securities, asset-backed securities, U.S. Government debt securities (including its agencies and instrumentalities), convertible debt securities, and preferred stock that is convertible into common stock. The Fund generally invests in investment grade fixed-income securities, although it may invest up to 5% of its total assets in securities rated below investment grade.

ABOUT RISK
